This role demands a proactive approach to professional development, data analysis, and advocacy for students with diverse learning needs.

Key Responsibilities:

- Programme leadership and implementation: Develop, implement and evaluate the Learning Support
 Programme, ensuring alignment with ISSH's mission. Manage a team of support staff, including special education teachers and specialists.
- Student Support & ILPs: Identify students in need of additional learning support, conduct assessments and create tailored ILPs. Regularly monitor and adjust these plans to ensure student progress.
- Collaboration & Communication: Work closely with classroom teachers to integrate support strategies into the curriculum. Maintain regular communication with parents and external professionals to ensure a comprehensive support system.
- Professional Development: Provide training and guidance to staff on best practices in supporting diverse learners. Keep up to date with the latest research and developments in special education.
- Provide specialised EAL instruction in small group settings, catering to diverse language proficiency levels.
- Provide guidance in organisation skills and assessment prep as well as strong foundational skills in Maths.
- Assess and track student progress in English language development.
- Develop instructional strategies and materials tailored to English language learners.

- Excellent organisational, collaboration, and communication skills to work effectively with students, teachers, and parents.
- Ability to analyse student performance data to inform instructional decisions and support student progress.
